Paying for sex B2. Exchanging/demanding goods for sex B3. Exchanging/demanding services/access to services for sex B4. Exchanging/demanding employment for sex B5. Sexual activity with a beneficiary

Sexual harassment UN Secretary-General's Bulletin on Discrimination, sexual harassment and harassment are defined in SG's bulletin ST/SGB/2008/5	<p>Sexual harassment is any unwelcome sexual advance, request for sexual favour, verbal or physical conduct or gesture of a sexual nature, or any other behaviour of a sexual nature that might reasonably be expected or be perceived to cause offence or humiliation to another, when such conduct interferes with work, is made a condition of employment or creates an intimidating, hostile or offensive work environment.</p> <p>While typically involving a pattern of behaviour, it can take the form of a single incident.</p> <p>Sexual harassment may occur between persons of the opposite or same sex.</p> <p>Both males and females can be either the victims or the offenders.</p>	C1. Stalking C2. Sexual/indecent exposure C3. Forced contact of an intimate/sexual nature C4. Unwanted verbal comments of a sexual nature
D. Other internal reportable issues	Other actions that do not fall in the three categories above but must still be reported	D1. Human trafficking D2. Inappropriate conduct (bullying, intimidation, inappropriate language) D3. Undisclosed sex offender D4. Accessing or having pornography (not child) via an Oxfam device D5. Sexual or romantic relationship against the code of conduct and conflict of interest policy (for instance, in the line of management, with partner staff, or otherwise leading to conflicts of interest) D6. Child Abuse (physical, emotional, neglect, or other non-sexual harm to an under 18)
